Categories

1. Family Visiting Rooms with a Jacks' toy box. The Family Visiting Room must be specifically designed comfortable (family friendly private) and appropriately furnished and available to families at all times. The room must be designated and sign posted (with the white and yellow laminated signs provided).

NNAAMI sponsor information is displayed on toy boxes and Jacks' toy box folder available in the room at all times. Jacks' Toy Box maintained by mental health service / unit manager.

 (a) For units with a Jacks' toy box, where the unit does not have a room specially designed as a Family Visiting Room but can demonstrate the availability of another suitable room families can access. The room must be designated and sign posted (with the white and yellow laminated signs provided) available as a Family Visiting Room (multi purpose), that will provide families privacy while visiting till a specially designed family visiting room is incorporated into the MHS unit. NNAAMI sponsor information is displayed on toy boxes and Jacks' toy box folder available in the room at all times. Jacks' Toy Box maintained by mental health service / unit manager.

Other additional categories

AA. Good Standard Best Practice

ie all above in categories 1 or 1(a), and many have better quality comfortable furnishing including TV, board games or educational games for all ages / appropriate computer games available, drinking water, Electric Kettle & Coffee & Tea Making Jug & Cups etc.

AAA. High Standard, Best Practice, Family Visiting Room.

ie all above in categories 1 or 1(a) and AA, and may have good reading material or reading lighting or a computer available for young people, student desk, & radio TV, VHS, CD, DVD player, and drinking water, a microwave *for families to heat up a meal or snack while visiting*.

Gold Medal Certificate AAA

Exceptionally High Standard, Best Practice, Family Visiting Room. Reserved for exceptional effort,

in furniture appointments design and layout of a room meeting all or most of the other categories requirements above while catering for all ages.
